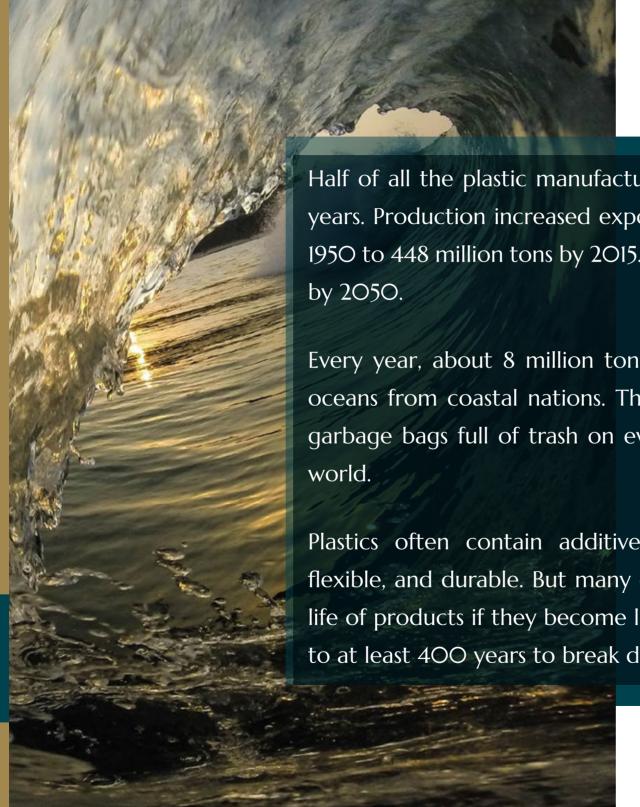


01	ABOUT US

ABOUT US



Half of all the plastic manufactured has been made in the last 15 years. Production increased exponentially, from 2.3 million tons in 1950 to 448 million tons by 2015. Production is expected to double by 2050.

Every year, about 8 million tons of plastic waste ends up in the oceans from coastal nations. That's the equivalent of setting five garbage bags full of trash on every foot of coastline around the world.

Plastics often contain additives making them stronger, more flexible, and durable. But many of these additives can extend the life of products if they become litter, with some estimates ranging to at least 400 years to break down.

#### CREATING A LEGACY

#### Eliminate Waste and Unnecessary Material Use;

Reduce packaging (avoid, reuse, replace, and establish take-back schemes with suppliers).

Use recycled content materials, products and packaging (post consumer waste is ideal).

Reduce paper use in all areas; use IOO% post-consumer recycled content paper in all areas (printer paper, branding, toilet tissue); double-sided printing; encourage paperless communication.

Avoid unnecessary giveaways; if giveaways are a must, then, consider useful items (e.g., sunscreen, hats, reusable bags/cutlery).













#### **BECOMING AN INSPIRATION**

#### Reduce; Reclaim and Reuse

Any lanyards should be of a reusable type collected at the end of the event so that they can be used another time.

Any merchandising or sponsors at events shall distribute items that have a use and are made from recyclable materials.

No use of single portion food/drink items (condiments) such as ketchup/mayonnaise pouches or single portion milk containers. Instead, these must come in bottles or cartons in a shared area.





## BEGINNING OF A NEW JOURNERY

## Reinforce 1st and 2nd Year Projects

No plastic cable ties should be used anywhere in the event, but use bungee or Velcro re-usable straps.

All signage should not be laminated but in waterproof durable paper.

Any banners used in the event must be made of recyclable materials.

No single use plastic cups must be used in the event but either use glass or the recyclable paper ones.
